

ORDINANCE NO. 4

TITLE I ORDINANCE REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 3 AND ESTABLISHING SUPERVISOR DISTRICTS FOR BUTLER COUNTY, IOWA, FOLLOWING 1990 CENSUS FIGURES.

BE IT ENACTED by the Butler County Board of Supervisors: (1) Ordinance No. 3 is repealed totally and (2) the Butler County Supervisors establish the three Supervisor Districts as follows:

Supervisor District # 1 Fremont, Dayton, Jackson-Jefferson (the two townships combined excluding any parts of the Cities of Allison and Clarksville), Butler (including all of the City of Clarksville), and Shell Rock (including all of the City of Shell Rock). Population--5,250

Supervisor District # 2 Coldwater (including the City of Greene), Bennezette (including the City of Aredale), Pittsford (including the City of Dumont and excluding any part of the City of Bristow), West Point-Bristow (West  $\frac{1}{2}$  of West Point Township including all of the City of Bristow), West Point-Allison (East  $\frac{1}{2}$  of West Point Township including all of the City of Allison), Ripley-Madison and Washington-Northwest (Sections one (1) through twenty (20) and Sections twenty-nine (29), thirty (30), thirty one (31) and thirty two (32). Population--5,210

Supervisor District # 3 Washington--Southeast (Sections twenty-one (21) through twenty eight (28) and sections thirty three (33) through thirty six (36), Monroe (including the City of Aplington and excluding any part of the City of Parkersburg), Albion (including all of the City of Parkersburg), and Beaver (including all of the City of New Hartford). Population--5,271

For all political elections, the Townships of Jackson and Jefferson are combined into one precinct; also the Townships of Ripley and Madison are combined into one. The City of Clarksville and Township of Butler are combined into one precinct.

This Ordinance shall be in effect upon final passage of same and upon completion of required publications.
